EUGENE COMMUNITY

Eugene is the second largest city in Oregon with a population of 163,460, while the Eugene/Springfield metro area has a population of 351,794. Nearby institutions of higher learning are: University of Oregon, Northwest Christian University, Pacific University (satellite), New Hope Christian College, and Lane Community College. Eugene is home to world-renowned forests and rivers, bike and running trails, the NCAA and Olympic track trials, and the historic Hayward Field.

SHELDON COMMUNITY

Sheldon is one of the five area high schools in the Eugene 4j School District. Our high school is a four-year comprehensive school with yearly enrollment of approximately 1,512 (Sept. 2017). We are *accredited* by the Northwest Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges. Sheldon has an FTE of 55, and 100% of our teachers are Highly Qualified.

DEMOGRAPHICS

Economically disadvantaged: 28%, mobile students: 10.5%, different languages spoken: 15, graduation rate: 87.6%, drop out rate: 1.1%. American Indian/Alaska Native: 1%, Asian 4%, Black/African American 1%, Hispanic/Latino 12%, Multiracial 9%, White 72%. (Oregon Report Card, ODE website 2017)

INTERNATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL (IHS), INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE (IB)

Eugene International High School has three campuses in the 4j school district that are a school within a school model that Henry D. Sheldon High School is a part of. Students take literature and social studies along with their IHS course work in a A-B-C rotation schedule for the entire school year in the afternoon or morning. The rest student's day they take IHS/IB science, world language, and math. Entry to IHS is through the 4J School Choice lottery. IHS is a rigorous college preparatory school that emphasizes a study of history and cultures. Students are required to take three years of a world language, write a 3500-4000 word extended essay research paper, and complete 150 hours of Creativity, Action, and Service to meet IHS graduation requirements. Across 11th and 12th grades, students have the option of working toward the International Baccalaureate Diploma by completing coursework and taking comprehensive examinations in six subject areas. Entry to IHS is through the 4J School Choice lottery.

INTERNATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL: SPANISH IMMERSION (SI)

Students who are also enrolled in the Spanish Immersion (SI) program take four years of Spanish Literature/Composition courses and Spanish-language content courses when offered. The Spanish Literature courses meets these students world language college entry requirement and can be awarded college world language credit through Lane Community College. Many of these students have been through the elementary and middle school Spanish immersion programs that feed into Sheldon. These students are in same classes that their regular IHS counterparts attend with the exception of world language; this is rolled into their Spanish Literature classes.

COMMON GROUND

While language arts (LA) and social science (SS) areas are program specific to IHS and Honors, areas of math (MA), science (SC) and world language (AF) are not designated IHS or Honors until advanced levels are attained. Then courses may be AP or IB or CN or may be designated AP/IB/CN (College Now - see category below).

EUGENE 4j DIPLOMA SEAL

In order to graduate with the Eugene 4j Diploma Seal, students must have a 3.5 cumulative GPA at graduation, 25 high school credits, and complete 120 hours of documented community service.

HONORS

The Honors Program requires additional reading, writing and research in the Language Arts. Courses in grades 9 and 10 are designated as honors on the transcript. Students have the option of enrolling in honors level coursework in language arts, social studies, or both. Typically, students enrolled in honors courses will be well prepared to transition to Advanced Placement (AP) courses in junior and senior years.

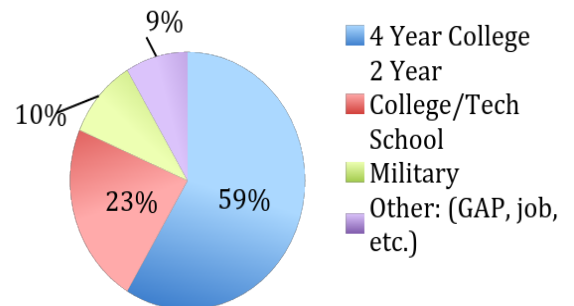
